Winner of this year's Oscar for Best Documentary Feature, No Other Land, documents the fight over Masafer Yatta, a Palestinian community in the West Bank and the efforts of its residents to resist forced eviction by the Israeli government.

No Other Land was conceived by a group of four Palestinian-Israeli activists and filmed between 2019 and 2023. The film graphically records the destruction of a Palestinian community in the occupied West Bank.

Set in the 1980s and starring, Emma Watson, Ciaran Hinds and Cillian Murphy as Bill Furlong, this film is dedicated to the female victims of the Magdalene Laundries.
